CENTRAL REGISTRY UPDATE – GOLD AGAIN

ASCR has had another great year! The 2007 data submission was awarded the gold certificate in NAACCR call for data. The National Program of Cancer Registries also began its certificate program for the first time, and ASCR met all three standards – National Data Quality and Completeness Standard (previously 24 month standard), Advanced National Data Quality and Completeness Standard (previously 12 month standard), and USCS publication standard.

All of these achievements are a great recognition for such high quality and timely data from various reporting facilities across the state. We want to share this honor with each of you and say **Thank You** for all you do.

ASCR is glad to welcome two new staff members – Teisha Robertson and Rhonda Morgan. They will be eager to meet you all in the ACRA fall meeting. More information about our new staff members can be found on page 7.

ASCR is working hard to get our software upgraded for 2010. We expect to have Prep Plus and CRS updated in the next week or two – this means we will be able to process both V11 and V12 NAACCR format files. Abstract Plus and Web Plus will not be ready for another month or so.

For facilities with commercial software, if you finish 2009 cases, you can update your software and then start 2010 cases. We only accept 2010 cases in V12 NAACCR format. We still anticipate some problems during this conversion period. Please let me know should you experience any problem in your software upgrade.

Due to the delays in software upgrade, we will not count your cases late and not count errors against you for this month, and possibly for the next month's data submission also.

Class of Cases

Code for Class of Case is expanded to two characters in 2010 data. The ASCR requirement on report abilities will be changed accordingly. The following classes of cases should be reported to ASCR.

Updates for Casefinding Auditor Hospitals

All the CFA hospitals should have completed their 2009 casefinding process and should have received a list of reportable cases from your casefinding auditor, according to the CFA schedule by June 1, 2010. Those cases were due to be entered into **Web Plus by July 31, 2010**. The new schedule for casefinding audit information and cases to be abstracted is now available at Download page of the ASCR website.

Web Plus is now upgraded to version 2.0.19. This version enables ASCR and reporting facilities to securely exchange confidential data. This is a step forward for ASCR's efforts in paperless reporting. It also allows ASCR to receive NAACCR V12 files now.

In your web plus account, click the "File Upload" link under "ASCR Basic" to enter File Upload page. Facilities can use "New Upload" to send casefinding information to us, if your system is able to generate the e-file. The file that is sent from ASCR can be accessed in "Download Files".

If there is any personnel changes at your facility, please notify your casefinding auditor as soon as possible, so we can update our contact list, change the web plus account as needed, and follow up with the new abstractor to ensure reporting is not interrupted.

Updates on New Data Transfer System - Web Plus

After more than six years, we are ready to retire our very first secure online data transfer system. Web Plus is not a new system for us. Many of you are using it now. It has been extensively used by small hospitals and non-hospital facilities for abstracting cases. Now it will also be used by ASCR to exchange confidential data with all the reporting facilities too. Like the retired system, you can send essentially any kind of file to the ASCR.

The death clearance follow back list and path report follow back list will be sent to facilities through Web Plus accounts. Please check your account often for those requests. It is very important for ASCR to hear back from you on these requests in a timely manner. If we do not hear from you, a second, even a third request may be sent to you and in the near future, this may be another criteria for your facilities compliance status with meeting ASCR requirements.

The Web Plus system may not look much different from the previous online data transfer system when you upload files, but it is different on the ASCR's side. Here are some tips to help us track your files.

- 1) File Name use your facility initial or common short name with date you make the file, like ascrJulySub20100802.txt or ascrPathList20100802.txt
- 2) In the <u>comment</u> field, please indicate who your regional coordinator is. This will help the Web Plus administrator distribute the files to the correct regional coordinator upon receiving your file.
- 3) If you send a non-NAACCR format file, please check "Non-NAACCR File" before you select your file. This way, the edit engine will not be activated to run edits on this file.
- 4) When you submit a large data file, you do not have to wait for the edit report to finish. You can get back to your account later to check the edit report by clicking on Previous Uploads.

As always, we want to hear from you on how to improve our process.

Q & A

Q: Is an endometrial primary with a final pathology diagnosis of "adenocarcinoma with squamous differentiation" coded 8070/3, 8140/3, 8560/3 or 8570/3? Is squamous differentiation the same as squamous metaplasia?

A: Use the Other Sites histology codes, single tumor, invasive and stop at H11. Code adenocarcinoma with squamous metaplasia (8570/3). Be careful not to confuse endometrial carcinoma (site) with endometroid carcinoma (histologic type). Curator (*I & R Team*)

Q: Is the topography code for an angiosarcoma of the breast C50.9 breast or C49.3 soft tissue of the chest?

A: The topography code for an angiosarcoma of the breast is C50.9 (I & R Team)

Q: If a patient had infiltrating ductal ca associated with DCIS and additional separate DCIS in the same breast, is this multiple tumors in one primary tumor?

A: First use MP/H rule M11 which states that multiple intraductal and/or ductal carcinoma is a single primary (page 300). Then use rule H27 which states to code the invasive histology when both invasive and in situ are present (page 305). This is a single primary of infiltrating duct cell ca (8500/3). (*I & R Team*)

Q: Patient had malignant melanoma in 2006 and in 2008 a bowel resection that showed metastatic melanoma. Path Report said, "histologically similar to previous melanoma." Is this coded as FORDS recurrence or do we use MPH rules to code and does the histology count as a statement of metastasis from the path report?

A: The MP/H Rules do not apply to tumors described as metastasis. A metastasis is never a new primary. Curator (*I & R Team*)

Tips/Reminders for Abstracting:

- Please double check Date of Birth and Social Security Number to make sure the numbers are in the correct sequence.
- Text is required for all tumor data, procedures and treatment, including dates.
- Please note in text: age, sex and race of patient. This provides us with vital information when two sources
 send in conflicting information for these fields or when we are reviewing first name and gender. It saves ASCR
 staff from making telephone calls to hospital registrars and hospital registrars from having to look-up cases.
