## This form is for people who have a moderately to severely weakened immune system who have already received 2 doses of Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.

If you meet the <u>criteria</u> outlined by the CDC, it is recommended that you get a 3<sup>rd</sup> dose of an mRNA (Pfizer or Moderna) vaccine at least 28 days after your 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of vaccine. When possible, you should receive the same vaccine. For example, if you got a series of Pfizer vaccine, try to get a Pfizer vaccine for your 3<sup>rd</sup> dose. Talk to your doctor about the need to get a 3<sup>rd</sup> dose of COVID-19 vaccine and the best timing of a 3<sup>rd</sup> dose.

- Receiving active cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood;
- Received an organ transplant and am taking medicine to suppress my immune system;
- Received a stem cell transplant within the last 2 years or am taking medicine to suppress the immune system;
- Moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency (such as DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome);
- Advanced or untreated HIV infection;
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids or other drugs that suppress my immune response

It is important to continue to protect yourself after you get a 3<sup>rd</sup> dose of vaccine. This includes wearing a well-fitting mask, maintaining physical distance, avoiding crowded places or spaces with poor air flow, and washing hands often. Consider "double masking" (wearing a cloth face mask over surgical mask) or an N95 respirator for a higher level of protection.
