Environmental Modifications

 Anything that has been added to an environment to assist in the participation of activities of daily living

Who Could Use Environmental Adaptations?

- Anyone!
- Home adaptations meet the needs of individuals with illnesses, injuries, and disabilities as well as people who are healthy and wish to grow older safely in their homes

Considerations

- Who will be living in my home?
- How do I use each space in my home?
- What is my budget?

Modification Expenses

- · Free to low cost
- Midrange expenses
- Significant investments

Free / Low Cost Home Modifications

- De-clutter
- · Rearrange furniture
 - Consider placing chairs and sofas with their backs to the windows to reduce glare from the sun
- Remove throw rugs and worn carpet to prevent falls

Free / Low Cost Home Modifications

- · Watch for small pets
 - Add bells to pet collars for an auditory alert of their presence
- Add high contrast visual markers to stairs, grab bars, door frames, etc.

Free / Low Cost Home Modifications

 Create a color contrast between doors and door frames and furniture and floor to increase visibility and assist with navigation within the home

Free / Low Cost Home Modifications

- Organize your belongings into predictable groups and store supplies near the activity for which they are used
- · Always provide adequate lighting
- Use a cart with wheels to move items from room to room

Low Cost Adaptive Equipment

- Forks and spoons with large diameter handles
 - -\$10-\$15
- Rocker knives
 - -\$15-\$25
- Scoop dishes
 - -\$10-\$25

Low Cost Adaptive Equipment

- Hip kits (\$25-\$40)
 - -Generally provided after hip surgery
 - Also very useful for people with limited flexibility
 - -Long handled sponge (\$8-\$10)
 - -Sock aids (\$15-\$20)
 - -Reachers (\$15-\$20)

Mid-range Home Modifications

- Install open shelving under cabinets to provide additional reachable storage
- Replace existing knob handles with loop handles
- Replace faucet knobs that turn with levels

Mid-range Home Modifications

 Removing cabinets and opening a knee space under sinks provides better access for a seated user

Mid-range Home Modifications

- Incorporate fall prevention mats to help prevent falls when transferring from sitting to standing
 - -\$115
- Use lift chairs / recliners to assist in transferring from sit to stand
 - -\$1,000-\$1,600

Mid-range Home Modifications

 Add motion sensor lights to the inside and outside of the home

Significant Investments in Home Modifications

- The price for bathroom renovations begins at approximately \$5,000
 - -Tub removal and installation of walk-in shower
 - -Installation of grab bars

Significant Investments in Home Modifications

- Widen existing doorways to accommodate a wheelchair or scooter
- Expand bathroom to allow for 5 x 5 floor clearance for a toilet

Significant Investments in Home Modifications

- Stair Lifts
 - -\$1,500
- Outdoor Ramps
 - -Prices vary on several factors
 - Length
 - Portable vs. fixed
 - Materials

Aging in Place

- Aging in place allows people to remain in their homes for as long as possible
 - Consider your future needs and the future needs of your family members when purchasing or building / remodeling a home

Aging in Place

- Making gradual modifications to your present home help prevent injuries and promote living as independently and as functionally as possible
- -Consult an occupational therapist for a home assessment if your living environment needs modifications
