## By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, rural communities in Alabama, and throughout the United States, are wonderful places to live and work. They are places where people know each other, listen to and respect each other and work together to benefit the community; and

WHEREAS, rural America is the economic engine that helped the United States become the world leader it is today; and

WHEREAS, rural citizens possess a selfless, creative and community-minded spirit; and

WHEREAS, meeting the unique healthcare needs of those citizens is constantly evolving; and

WHEREAS, while only 20 percent of the nation's population lives in rural America, the majority of trauma deaths in the nation occur in these communities, making ambulatory and emergency medical services especially critical; and

WHEREAS, rural hospitals, in addition to being sources of innovation and resourcefulness that reach beyond geographical boundaries to deliver quality care, are also the economic foundation of their communities; and

WHEREAS, the Alabama Office of Primary Care and Rural Health and the National Organization of State Offices of Rural Health play a distinct and critical role by leading efforts to address the unique healthcare needs of our rural citizens;

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, the Honorable Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim November 17, 2022, as
