For this specific definition, counties are assigned a score using four major indicators of rurality. These are population per square mile, the size and number of cities in a county, percentage of total employment comprised by employment in public education, and per capita agricultural sales. THE USER CAN REFER TO THE "MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENT MORTALITY" SECTION ON PAGE 16 IN THE "COUNTY SPECIFIC DATA" PUBLICATION WHERE IT CAN BE SEEN THAT THE HIGHEST MORTALITY RATES FOR MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS IN THAT COMMISSION REGION ARE IN THE RURAL COUNTIES OF GENEVA (45.6), HENRY (42.4), AND BARBOUR (32.8).
