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ENROLLED, An Act,

Relating to public health; to authorize the Department of Public Health to provide education and services regarding care for individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases to those individuals, their families, and the general public; to repeal Sections 22-50-70, 22-50-71, 22-50-72, 22-50-73, and 22-50-74, Code of Alabama 1975, in order to remove the responsibility and authority to do so from the Department of Mental Health; and to provide for funding.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the Dementia Education and Training Act Alabama Alzheimer's and Dementia Education, Care, and Training Act.

Section 2. The purposes of this act are:

- (1) To enable Alabamians with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases to live with dignity in their homes or community for as long as possible.
- (2) To develop an array of services that follows individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases and maintains their independence in the community.
- (3) To provide appropriate services for Alabamians with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related diseases residing in both rural and urban settings.

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1	(4) To emphasize and implement cost-efficient,
2	low-technology, high-yield services that can currently benefit
3	thousands of Alabama citizens.
4	(5) To allow Alabamians to pay for services based on
5	their individual resources.
6	Section 3. (a) Subject to Section 5, the Department
7	of Public Health shall develop educational programs and an
8	array of is authorized to develop educational programs and
9	services concerning Alzheimer's disease, dementia, and related
10	diseases. These programs and services shall be offered to
11	individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or related
12	diseases, the families of these individuals, and the general
13	<pre>public.</pre>
14	(b)(1) The department shall may provide instructors
15	to train and provide support to each of the following:
16	a. Members of the families of individuals with
17	Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar diseases.
18	b. Health care providers who provide care for
19	individuals with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar
20	diseases at the home of the individual or a member of the
21	family of the individual, or a similar residential location.
22	c. Other caregivers who provide care for individuals
23	with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or similar diseases at the
24	home of the affected individual or a member of the family of
25	the individual, or similar residential location.

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1	(2) These instructors shall may provide technical
2	assistance, training, support, and advice that will accomplish
3	both of the following:
4	a. Encourage the providing of long-term care for
5	such individuals in the home of the individual, or a member of
6	the family of the individual, or a similar residential
7	location.
8	b. Reduce health care costs to the state, the family
9	of the affected individual, and health care facilities.
LO	Section 4. The Department of Public Health shall may
11	adopt rules to implement this act.
12	Section 5. (a) The Legislature shall appropriate
1.3	sufficient sums from the Education Trust Fund for each of the
14	four fiscal years commencing with the fiscal year ending
15	September 30, 2019, to establish and implement the
16	requirements of this act. Thereafter, sufficient funding shall
17	be annually appropriated by the Legislature to maintain the
18	programs and services required by this act:
19	The Legislature is authorized to appropriate funding
20	to establish and implement the requirements of this act and to
21	maintain the programs and services required by this act.
22	(b) The Department of Public Health shall is
23	authorized to implement the requirements of this act to the
24	extent funding is provided.

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1	(c) The department may accept gifts, grants, and
2	donations offered in support of the services established by
3	this act.
4	(d) The department may assess reasonable fees from
5	recipients of the services provided by this act, if the
6	recipient is able to pay for the services. If the recipient is
7	able to pay a portion of a fee, the department shall collect
8	that portion from the recipient. All fees collected shall be
9	used by the department for the purposes of this act.
10	Section 6. Sections 22-50-70, 22-50-71, 22-50-72,
11	22-50-73, and 22-50-74, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to
12	domestic dementia education and training, are repealed.
13	Section 7. This act shall become effective on the
14	first day of the third month October 1, 2019, following its
15	passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise
16	becoming law.
